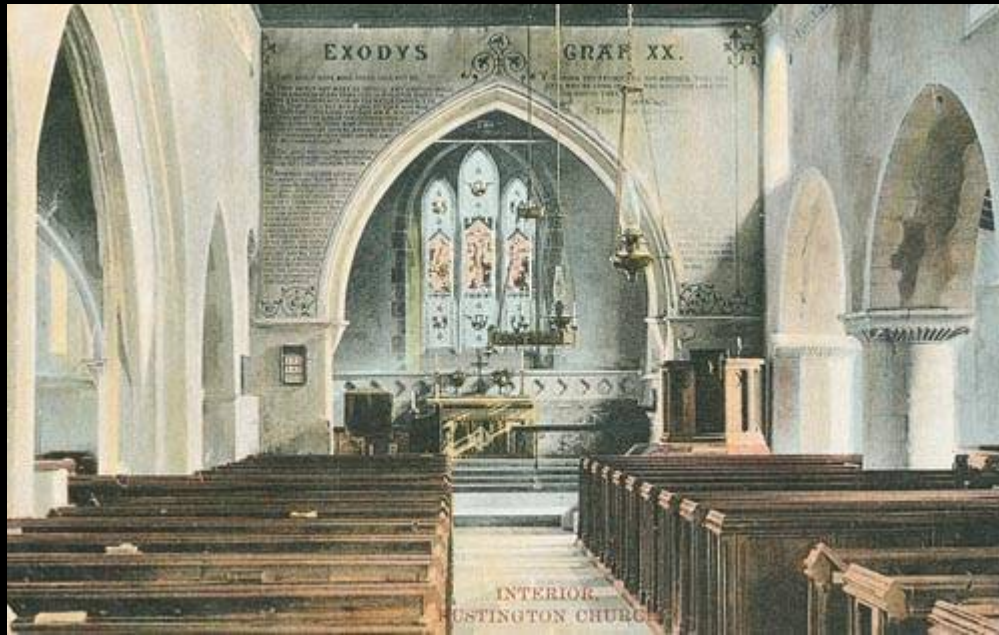


We have an ancient building - The Church dates from 1170

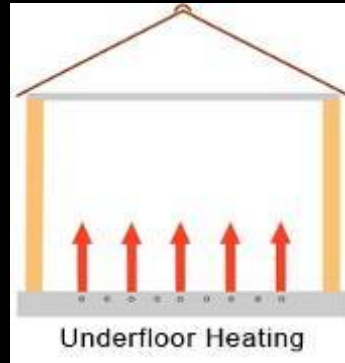
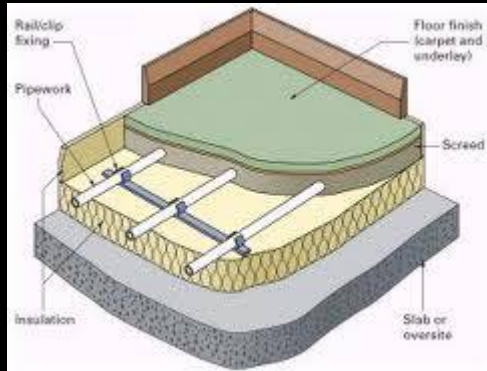




It is 150 years after the last refurbishment so it is time to update the church. The main features of the project are:-

- *a new heating system,*
- *a new floor*
- *a nave altar and a place for prayer and services at the east end of the church*
- *a children's area*
- *better lighting*
- *an improved audio and a new visual system*
- *Flexible seating*
- *a glazed area to the west end to use as a welcome space*
- *redcoration*
- *improved toilet facilities*

A new heating system



We will have a new gas fired under-floor system with radiators



The current system is electric. It dates from the 1930, is expensive to run and the church is cold
