If you would like to make a monetary donation towards chocolates for the children, please pass to either Philippa Dabin, Jan Watson or Barbara Faux before that date. Thank you.

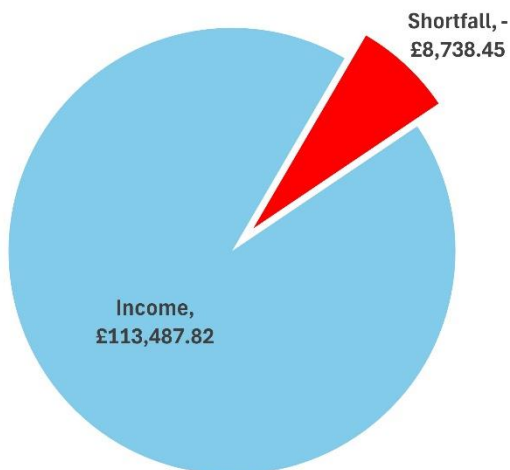

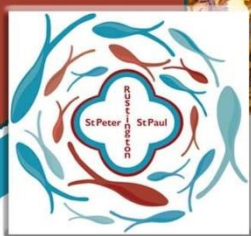
